Health/Physical Activity	<p>Funding will be used to pay for an Olympian or Paralympian to spend a day in school to promote health and physical activity.</p>	£1149	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This will inspire children to become more involved in sport and physical activity and will promote the importance of health and physical activity. • Three international Olympians attended school sports day and ran an assembly to open the events. This inspired some children to push themselves further in sport. • This will improve G&T provision and enable G&T children to make greater progress. A high percentage of G&T signed up to sports clubs in the Autumn Term and many linked to external clubs. Therefore, this funding was reallocated, as described below. • This will inspire children to become more involved in sport and physical activity and will promote the importance of health and physical activity. It will also help to tackle childhood obesity in the school. The club was beneficial for the children who attended but this only affected a small number of children. In 2017-2018 we will consider how we can spend this money to impact upon a greater number of children. • The school has developed links with Aylesbury United Football Club. They have run three clubs in the Spring and Summer Terms, which 51 children have attended. However, this did not cost the school anything so this money was reallocated as explained below.

All children participated in Sports Day and 60 children were involved in the leadership of this event. • New indoor and outdoor balls were purchased so that two classes could teach high-quality PE simultaneously and ball games and skills could be taught inside without
