<b>Competition</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In 2017/2018 we will enter 13 Level 2 competitions/festivals.</li> <li>Each festival will have an extra-curricular club linked to it so that children are coached in their sport prior to the festival. This should improve the school's outcomes at festivals. These clubs will be run free of charge using Sports Premium funding (see below).</li> <li>The festivals for this year will be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>KS1 Multiskills</li> <li>KS1 Athletics</li> <li>KS1 Skip 2B Fit</li> <li>KS2 High 5 Netball (2 teams)</li> <li>Y3/4 Mini Tennis</li> <li>Y3/4 BISI Badminton</li> <li>Cycling</li> <li>Y5 Badminton</li> <li>Y5/6 Rounders (2 teams)</li> <li>Y6 Games</li> <li>Y5/6 Quad kids</li> <li>KS2 Tag Rugby</li> <li>KS2 Girls Football (2 teams)</li> <li>KS2 Boys Football (2 teams)</li> </ul> </li> <li>We will take two teams to the Y5/6 Rounders, High 5 Netball and Girls' and Boys' football festivals to give 'A' and 'B' teams the opportunity to participate in competitions.</li> </ul>	<b>Festivals included in Buckingham School Sports Partnership</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Increased number of pupils accessing extracurricular competitions. This provides opportunities for gifted and talented children to compete and for other children to experience competitions.</li> </ul>

<b>Professional Development</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Our new PE Leader will attend the Primary PE Conference and Primary Link Teacher training days. The Buckingham School Sports Partnership membership also provides membership to the Youth Sport trust so our PE Leader will attend CPD courses including the PLT Modules 1-6, 'lesson planning and curriculum design' and 'physically literate to the physically educated'.</li> <li>Additional CPD courses will be provided for the PE Leader.</li> <li>A refresher REAL PE course will be run for new staff and the PE Leader on the INSET day in January 2018.</li> </ul>	<b>PLT Training included in the Buckingham School Sports Partnership</b> <b>£500</b> <b>£1000</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>As our PE Leader is new to the role, this will provide CPD opportunities for him to develop.</li> <li>The Primary Link Teacher training days will enable the PE Leader to network with other schools and organise inter-school competitions and to receive local, national and OFSTED updates about PE and School Sport.</li> <li>Through networking on these days, inter-school competitions will be organised. This will allow more children to participate in extra-curricular competitive sport and enable more parents to attend competitions.</li> <li>As our PE Leader is new to the role, this will provide CPD opportunities for him to develop.</li> <li>All staff will have received full training in REAL PE and therefore the quality of curriculum PE lessons will improve.</li> </ul>
<b>Equipment</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Due to the increased number of pupils in the school (movement to two-form entry). A second set of PE equipment will be bought to enable two classes to teach high-quality PE at the same time.</li> <li>Updated interactive REAL PE resources will be purchased to enable teachers to teach higher quality PE.</li> <li>PE equipment for EYFS to develop the strand of Physical Development.</li> <li>Playground equipment to ensure pupils are active during the lunch break.</li> </ul>	<b>£3000</b>  <b>£1000</b>  <b>£3000</b>  <b>£2660</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This will enable two classes to teach high-quality PE at the same time and therefore will improve the quality of curriculum lessons in the school.</li> <li>REAL PE will be taught more consistently across the school and planning will be easier for teachers, therefore reducing teachers' workloads.</li> <li>Physical Development scores for EYFS increase.</li> <li>Pupils are more active and engaged in play and physical activity during the lunch break.</li> </ul>
